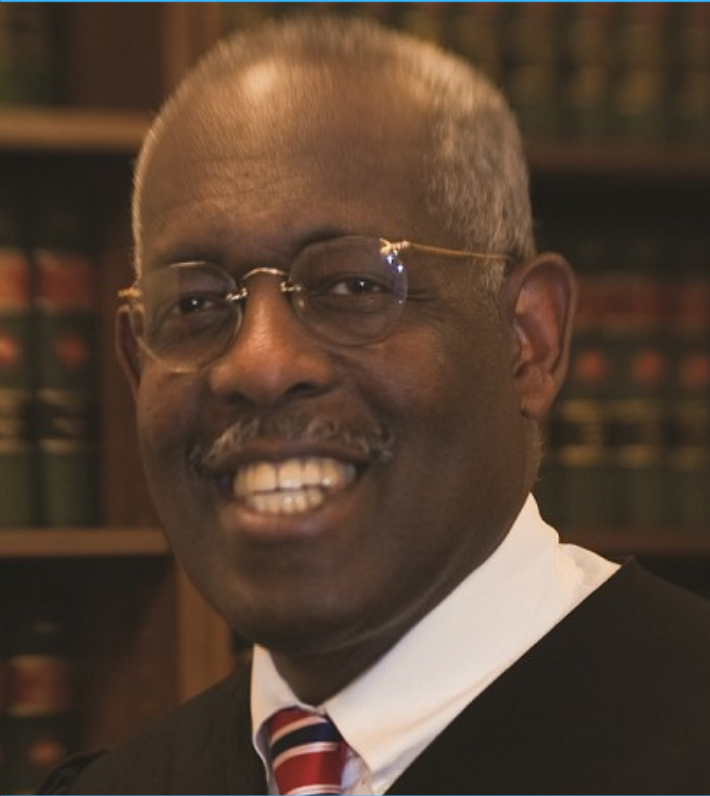

What we mean by Social Justice

It encompasses a wide range of legal issues that impact the daily lives and fundamental rights of low-income individuals, including access to housing, healthcare, employment, voting, and equal protection under the law.

Attorneys in this field use litigation, policy advocacy, and community engagement to challenge unjust systems and promote equity.

HONORING JUDGE LANGSTON C. McKINNEY



The Langston C. McKinney Social Justice Fellowship proudly honors the legacy of Judge Langston McKinney, a trailblazer whose life and career were rooted in justice, community, and service.

Born in Miami, Florida in 1944, Langston McKinney graduated from Howard University in 1965 with a degree in Chemistry. Recruited by Carrier Corporation, he relocated to Syracuse, NY, becoming the first Black scientist in their research and development division. After serving two years in the U.S. Army, he returned to Syracuse in 1968 to attend Syracuse University College of Law.

While in law school, Langston McKinney co-founded the Syracuse chapter of the Law Students Civil Rights Research Council (LSCRRRC) and spent the summer as a LSCRRRC intern in the South working on civil rights legal matters—an experience that fueled his lifelong passion for justice. He also began working at Onondaga Neighborhood Legal Services (ONLS), where he first witnessed the deep legal needs of people trapped in poverty. After several organizational expansions, ONLS would one day become what we are today – Legal Services of Central New York. This work sharpened his focus on justice, equality, and the power of law to transform lives.

After graduating law school, he began his legal career as a staff attorney at ONLS. He received the prestigious Reginald Heber Smith fellowship “Reggie”, and worked as a Reggie Fellow for two years. At ONLS he became a champion for tenants’ rights. He was later honored with the naming of McKinney Manor, a local housing complex. He went on to work at the Hiscock Legal Aid Society, building a strong reputation as a criminal defense attorney. Eventually, he co-founded Maye, McKinney & Melchor, the first Black law firm in Syracuse.

In 1986, Judge McKinney broke barriers when he was appointed by Mayor Tom Young as the first Black Syracuse City Court Judge. He was elected in 1987 and re-elected in 1997 and 2007. One of his most proud achievements was partnering with the Center for Community Alternatives to help establish the Syracuse Community Treatment Court, a restorative justice initiative addressing substance use disorders.

Though he retired in 2010, Judge McKinney remained deeply engaged in justice work. He helped found the William Herbert Johnson Bar Association, Onondaga County’s first African American bar association.

Judge McKinney’s enduring legacy continues to inspire. This fellowship seeks to carry forward his commitment to justice, equity, and mentorship for the next generation of Social Justice attorneys.
